


Place Names Act

NAMING OF PLACE

I, DELIA PHOEBE LAWRIE, the Minister for Planning and Lands, in pursuance of section 11 of the *Place Names Act*, approve the recommendation contained in a report by the Place Names Committee that the roads shown hatched on the plans appearing in the schedule be named Hicks Road, Littlejohn Road, McGill Road, Goy Road and Staines Court, as indicated on that plan.

NOTE:

HICKS ROAD

is named in commemoration of Lieutenant William Hicks of the brig 'Mary Elizabeth' which provisioned Fort Dundas; and his wife, Sophie, who died on 2/11/1827 becoming the first woman to die at Fort Dundas;

LITTLEJOHN ROAD

is named in commemoration of Wilson (Bill) Coleridge Littlejohn (1899-1987); Radio Operator, Pilot, Buffalo Shooter and Policeman/Superintendent; and Ellen Dorothy Littlejohn (nee Small) (1895-1982) Nursing Sister (Inland Mission Alice Springs); Police Officer's Wife supporting her husband and manning the Station in his absence while out on patrol;

McGILL ROAD

is named in commemoration of Arch McGill (1921-1998) Serviceman (RAAF), Station Manager (Tipperary), Adviser with NT Development Corporation (BTEC Scheme), Lands Board, President of both Darwin and Katherine & District Show Societies;

GOY ROAD

is named in commemoration of The Reverend Christopher Goy OBE (1897-1982); joined the Australian Inland Mission (AIM) in December 1936 his ministry covering most of the Top End and the Kimberley (WA); became the Army Chaplain in Darwin in 1939;

STAINES COURT

is named in commemoration of Ronald Arthur Staines (1927-1995) Plasterer/Builder; contributed to the development of Darwin during the 1960s and 70s; and Miriam Josephine Staines (1932-1994) a 'quiet achiever' within the community through caring for underprivileged children.
