


NAMING OF PLACE

I, DELIA PHOEBE LAWRIE, the Minister for Planning and Lands, in pursuance of section 11 of the *Place Names Act*, approve the recommendation contained in a report by the Place Names Committee that the road shown hatched on the plans appearing in the schedule be named Bottlebrush Avenue, Dargaville Close, Barramundi Close, Bunggulwuy Close, Fincham Close, Henning Madsen Close and Binga Close as indicated on those plans.

NOTE:

Bottlebrush Avenue is named after a species of Callistemous - an entirely

Australian genus of shrubs and small trees.

Dargaville Close is named after Stephen Dargaville, an active long term

member of the Nhulunbuy community.

Barramundi Close is named after the fish "Barramundi" also know as the

Giant Perch - "Lates calcarifer".

Bunggulwuy Close is so named as the area is where the spirits danced in

ceremony. "Bunggul" meaning dancing ceremony and

"wuy" meaning place.

Fincham Close is named after Harry and Joy Fincham, who were long

term residents of Nhulunbuy and actively involved in

sporting and community groups in the town.

Henning Madsen Close is named after the late Dr Henning Madsen, a highly

respected Nhulunbuy doctor.

Binga Binga Close is the local Rittatjingu peoples name for the hopping action

of the wallaby as it returns to its place of rest.
