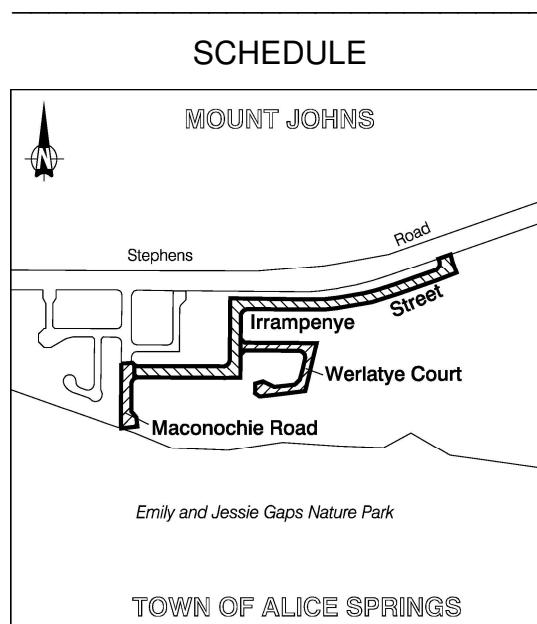
NAMING OF PLACE

I, Peter Glen Chandler, Minister for Lands, Planning and the Environment, under section 11(1)(a) of the *Place Names Act*, approve the recommendation contained in a report of the Place Names Committee for the Northern Territory that the roads shown *hatched* on the map in the Schedule be named Irrampenye Street, Werlatye Court and Maconochie Road.

*Note:*

*Irrampenye Street* named after one of the Traditional Owners of Alice Springs (male), born in the region of the Old Telegraph Station in the mid 1800's (pronounced irr-ram-pen-ya).

*Werlatye Court* named after one of the Traditional Owners of Alice Springs (female), born in the region of the Old Telegraph Station in the mid 1800's (pronounced wool-at-ya).

*Maconochie Road* named after John Maconochie who, at the time of his death, had been the longest serving Botanist in the NT, employed continuously in Alice Springs from 1967 to 1984.
