

McArthur River Mine Community Reference Group

Public Communique – Meeting held Thursday 27 March 2025

Members of the Community Reference Group (CRG) met in Darwin on Thursday 27 March 2025.

Independent Monitor (IM) Luke Stalley gave a general update on the annual report.

The report found that the McArthur River remains healthy, that fish are safe to eat and that there has been no significant change in environmental risks as a result of the mine's operations.

Overall compliance remains high but areas for improvement include more timely reporting to the regulator.

The community representative for the Independent Monitor gave a presentation on community engagement on the report and presented a summary of comments made by local stakeholders.

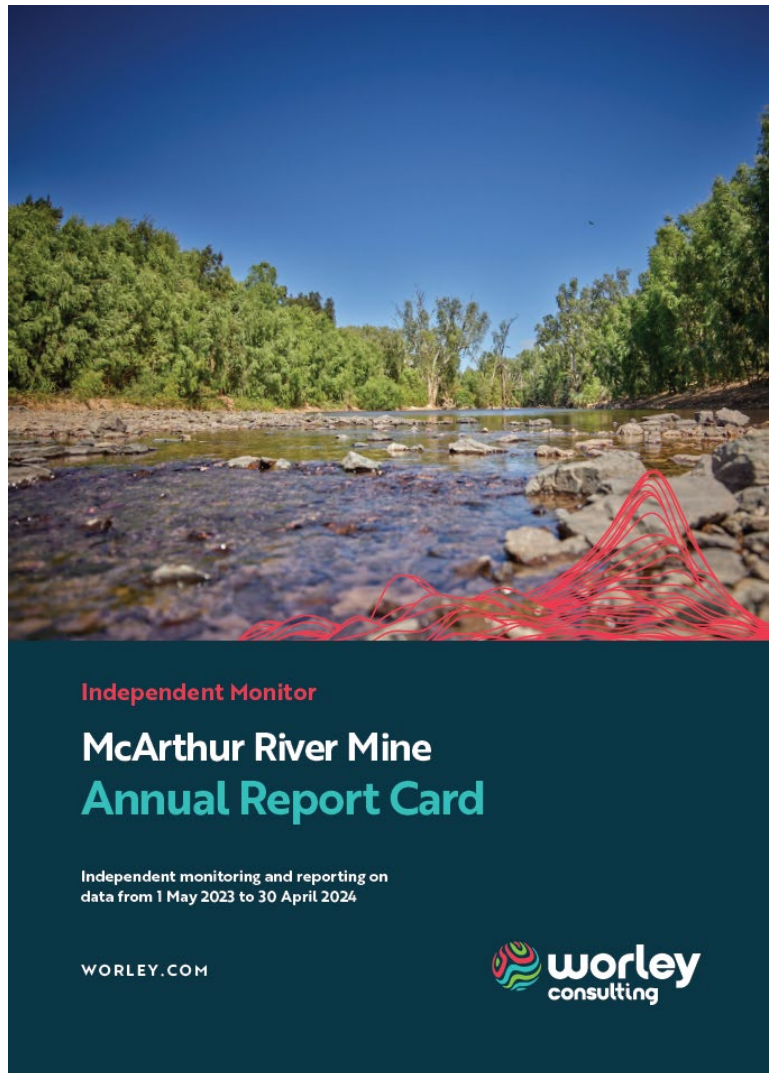
MRM Health, Safety and Environment Manager Lana Treasure gave a general update on operations, spoke in detail about the environmental incidents reported and outlined the steps MRM takes to ensure the environment is protected when concentrate spills occur on the Carpentaria Highway.

Safety on the highway was also a topic of conversation. MRM will be hosting a Road Safety Expo, co-hosted with Roper Gulf Regional Council, in Borroloola in May.

Members discussed opportunities to enhance communication with local residents and will discuss this further at its next meeting.

Complaints received in 2024 were reviewed and MRM explained how complaints are received, investigated and closed out. MRM is trying to encourage more complaints and feedback from community as a way to improve its performance.

The next meeting of the CRG will be held in Borroloola on Thursday 29 May 2025.
